### **BORN OF PASSION**

Great Barrier Reef Arena was born of the unbounded passion of a community that values the power of sport to bring people together, inspire participation and generate new opportunity.

Prior to development, the Harrup Park venue had been the primary sports venue in Central Queensland, hosting key cricket and AFL fixtures, including international one day cricket matches, Sheffield Shield, WBBL, JLT Community Series AFL matches and AFLW games.

The Australia vs India one day series staged at Great Barrier Reef Arena in September 2021 included the 'Miracle in Mackay, with Australia winning on the final ball and posting the third highest run chase in one day women's cricket history.

A WBBL match between Brisbane Heat and Adelaide Strikers in 2019 set the national venue attendance record for a standalone WBBL game. These major events have also fuelled the aspirations of a region, driving Cricket and AFL participation, particularly among girls and women, to record heights.

The precinct has also long been the home for key regional cultural and community events, a place to gather and celebrate throughout the year.

Now, together with our partners including State and Federal Government, peak sporting bodies and tourism organisations, we have created a superb environment for major sporting, entertainment and cultural events in one of Australia's most desirable destinations.

Here we have built upon passion to deliver a nationally significant precinct inspiring participation, celebrating community and proudly promoting our world renowned natural assets. Great Barrier Reef Arena is a place for all - from our local community to Australia's sporting stars and international athletes.

From project inception in 2017, our vision has been to create the best event destination experience in Australia.

Founded upon the strength of one of the nation's largest regional sports precincts and not-for-profit community Clubs, this magnificent venue is a premier cultural and sporting landmark for Queensland.

Great Barrier Reef Arena reflects the shared aspirations of our Club and community to create a world class event destination that will attract visitors from around the state, nation and globe to enjoy the pleasures of reef, rainforest and region.

The venue's flexible design and expansive spaces deliver the perfect setting for hosting everything from community cultural events to Queensland's very own Olympic Games.

## INVESTMENT

From a field of dreams to a vibrant new event destination, Great Barrier Reef Arena has been made possible by an investment of \$20 million by the Australian and Queensland Governments. Harrup Park also invested \$5.1 million in precinct development.

## HARRUP PARK

Harrup Park, a not-for-profit organisation founded by Mackay Cricket Association, is the region's leading leisure and sport destination.

The Club has over 28,000 members, with 45% female membership.

It supports 61 affiliated sporting and community clubs and has donated more than \$15.5 million to community organisations in the past decade.

This figure continues to grow, with over \$3 million donated to community in 2020/21 at the height of the Covid-19 pandemic.

It is one of Queensland's premier Clubs and, in March 2021, won the Clubs Queensland award for Support of Sport, recognising the Club's outstanding girls' and women's cricket programs.

Harrup Park also hosts a wide range of major community events each year.

Great Barrier Reef Arena is located in the tropical Queensland regional centre of Mackay, at the heart of one of Australia's most popular domestic and international tourism destinations.

Great Barrier Reef Arena is a world-class venue for elite cricket. The venue's reputation as a destination for international cricket was further enhanced in September 2021 with the successful hosting of the Australia vs India women's ODI series.

In recent years, WBBL matches in Mackay have also attracted the largest domestic crowds for a standalone WBBL game on record, nationally broadcast under 1500+ lux lighting.

The GBRA's innovative design ensures an exceptional event atmosphere in a regional centre comparable to major city venues around Australia.

Playing surface 165m North South and 130m East West – comparable to Sydney Cricket Ground (SCG) dimensions. The venue's design and facilities meet International Cricket Council (ICC) standards and requirements.

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

#### Great Barrier Reef Arena is one of the nation's premier regional venues for Australian Football League (AFL) matches.

In recent years both AFL and AFLW content have been held at the arena and nationally broadcast under 1500+ lux lighting.

#### **GROUND DIMENSIONS**

Field of play dimensions are 155m along the north-south axis and 130m on the east-west axis. This is comparable to the dimensions of the Sydney Cricket Ground (SCG).

The seating bowl enhances the intimate atmosphere, provides exceptional views and brings fans close to the action.





#### TIM MULHERIN COMMUNITY GREEN & MEMORIAL PLAZA

The late Tim Mulherin, a primary driver of the GBRA project and much loved former State Parliamentarian widely known as 'Mr Mackay', is commemorated by a gathering place, garden and arbour near the main Arena entrance.

The one-hectare Tim Mulherin Community Green, located behind the GBRA stand, provides dedicated public space for events including:

- Live Site (sporting events & performances)
- Open air cinema
- General community use and gatherings
- Markets and Pop-up Dining
- Meeting Place





#### **Batting for Mackay**

The unique Great Barrier Reef Arena positioning is designed to promote the region's attractions to external markets and inspire visitation through Australia's premier tourism asset.

The Great Barrier Reef attracts over 2 million people to the Mackay and Whitsundays region each year and is Queensland's primary tourism attraction.

The reef is also prominent feature of marketing campaigns led by Tourism Australia, Tourism and Events Queensland and Regional Tourism Organisations.

- The positioning capitalises on connection with domestic and international markets through the promotion, broadcast and digital streaming of popular major sporting events, including AFL and cricket
- It creates new capacity to market GBR holiday packages through major events and provide unique opportunities for the hosting of professional sporting Clubs from around Australia
- GBRA is partnering with key tourism bodies and industry to ensure full value of the positioning is realised through event scheduling, packaging and marketing

The opportunity for sale of commercial Arena naming rights was declined in favour of adopting an identity that delivers permanent value for the region's visitor economy and community.


Great Barrier Reef Arena is a flagship events destination that delivers new tourism product and ignites visitation from multiple markets to the many tourism assets on our doorstep.

The presentation and targeted marketing of major sport, cultural and entertainment events at Great Barrier Reef Arena will boost visitor attraction, spending and length of stay across the Mackay, Isaac and Whitsundays regions.

The national broadcast of major sporting events from GBRA also provides far-reaching exposure for the region's natural attractions and inspires the decision to visit.

## THE VALUE OF EVENT DRIVEN VISITATION<sup>1</sup>

- 38% of all Australian travellers have previously booked holidays of four nights or more to coincide with events. This is usual behaviour for 17% of all travellers.
- Festival and event goers have a clear preference for regional destinations and are repeat customers
- 34% of festival and event goers travelled to regional Australia on their most recent trip
- The most popular form of event attended was a sporting event
- Festival and event goers stayed longer when visiting regional Australia with an average length of stay of 6.7 nights in regional Australia compared with 6.1 nights in capital cities


